- This design looks to move the dining area deeper into garden making use of the whole space and creating different views of the garden
- Area for your dog near the kitchen door, which can be in grass or gravel is screened off from the dining area
- Small tree creates focal point when sitting in living room or on patio outside doors

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

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Planting Palette Ideas

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Planting

- Introduce 2 trees. 1 medium and 1 small with blossom. Provide some shade, screening and intimacy. Small tree provides a focal point looking out from living room in all three designs and helps balance the garden. Trees are shown at mature height which can take 15-20 years to reach
- Greens and silvers from grass with pops of white and yellow flowers and shrubs with soft contrast orange to provide interest to catch the eye
- Interest with modern simple colour scheme will come from leaf textures, shapes and sizes and shades in the greens
- Feature Hydrangea Limelight (see top right image on previous page) provide balance and structure to borders
- Focus on low maintenance and long flowering to create year round interest without too much effort

Materials

 Suggest new two tone grey paving paving to contrast with the house brick and compliment the doors, but existing pavers near house can be kept for path outside kitchen doors and around the side of the house to keep cost down (specifics to be provided with final design)
